

Archives and Collections

- P. G. Wodehouse Collection at Vanderbilt University:** See [this website's pages](#) for full information on the Vanderbilt collection.
- P. G. Wodehouse Archive at the British Library:** In 2016, Sir Edward Cazalet presented his personal [Wodehouse Archive](#) to the British Library on loan. Contact the library to learn how to view and access the material, which includes books, manuscripts, photographs, and ephemera.
- Dulwich College Archives:** The school that Wodehouse attended from 1894 to 1900 has an extensive collection of books, letters, magazines, photographs, recordings, and Wodehouse's notebooks from his early career. One of the college's three libraries is named after Wodehouse and features the desk, typewriter, and other artefacts donated by Lady Wodehouse after Plum's death. The archive is open only on [Wednesdays by appointment](#).
- Emsworth Museum:** Part of the Emsworth Maritime and Historical Trust, the [Emsworth Museum](#) holds a treasure trove of letters between PGW and Lillian Barnett, his housekeeper at Threepwood. Its collection of books focuses on the years Wodehouse lived in Emsworth (1904–14), and there are numerous other items of interest. The museum is open only on Saturdays, Sundays, and bank holidays between Easter Saturday and the end of October.
- Bodleian Library, Oxford:** There are more than 8,000 items relating to Wodehouse at this library. To search this collection, go to the [Bodleian's website](#) and enter "P G Wodehouse" in the search box, then follow the menus for more specific results.
- Columbia University Library:** Columbia's [Rare Book and Manuscript Library](#) includes the Reynolds Papers, a collection of correspondence between P. G. Wodehouse and his American agent, Paul Revere Reynolds. Search for "Paul Revere Reynolds" at the link given above. Adding "Middle Man" to the search will reveal *The Middle Man: The Adventures of a Literary Agent*, a book published by Morrow in 1972.
- Morgan Library and Museum:** The Morgan, in New York City, contains a very good collection of sheet music for Wodehouse's musicals, in addition to fourteen "literary and historical manuscripts." Go to their [search page](#) and enter "Wodehouse" to view the collection.
- New York Library for the Performing Arts:** This library has some 250 items relating to Wodehouse, including much information about his theatrical works. Finding those materials in their [research catalog](#) may prove to be a challenge.
- New York Public Library P. G. Wodehouse Collection:** The [library's collection](#) consists of 97 items encompassing typescripts, correspondence, and legal documents.
- Texas A&M University Library P. G. Wodehouse Collection:** As per the [Texas A&M web page](#), this small collection (eight folders) contains the original manuscript of *Nothing Serious* as well as letters and a photograph.
